## **CONTEMPORARY ART**

The striking marble vent hood above the <a href="LVE"><u>LVE</u></a> double oven range was inspired by sculptural elements of European kitchens the homeowners love. Its design "reflects an elegant, organic modern style," says Curtis.

AKING WITH THREE SMALL KIDS IS not for the fainthearted. To do it, you ideally need two things: a kitchen you love to spend time in and organization that makes cooking a joy. The owners of this

Dallas home sought to gain both through their remodel, which they hoped would transform their kitchen from a functional but boring cold, white space into a "wow moment in the heart of their home," says Ginger Curtis, president of Urbanology Designs. "They wanted a beautiful backdrop to their memories."

The team put the majority of the budget toward the kitchen's centerpiece: a reeded marble island, hand-carved to preserve its veining. They used the same marble a second time on the countertops and backsplash and, finally, on the range hood for dramatic impact. To save effort, time, and money, they opted to keep the original floors, feathering in new wood as needed and refinishing it all to match.

Another pièce de résistance is the coffee bar, "a once wasted space" that's now "loaded with storage," Curtis says. "This kitchen not only works better for our clients but improves how they live and feel on a daily basis," she points out. "It's wonderful to have a space that evokes joy every time you enter."



## **PERFECT FIT**

Urbanology designed the cabinetry to have "high levels of organization inside," says Curtis. **Oversize drawers** with **peg organizers** hold tableware secure and at kid level.
